- Also referred to as Great Northern Paper Mill

### Ownership History


**1970:** Great Northern Paper Company merged with Nekoosa-Edwards Paper Co. becoming Great Northern Nekoosa Corp.

1989: The Great Northern Paper Mill was taken over by Georgia-Pacific Corp. but the dams were still owned by Great Northern Nekoosa Corp. Shortly afterward Bowater Corp. of South Carolina purchased Great Northern's mills and timberland from Georgia-Pacific.

**2001:** Brookfield acquired the Mill dams<sup>7</sup>.

**2002:** Great Northern paper mill filed for bankruptcy.

**2003:** Great Northern paper mills in Millinocket and East Millinocket were purchased by Brascan Corp. and the company was renamed Katahdin Paper Company<sup>6</sup>.

### Technical specifics<sup>3</sup>

**North Twin:** 51 ft long, 35 ft tall earth-filled gravity dam

**Turbines:** 2 Vertical Francis, 1 Vertical Kaplan

Power capacity: 6.97 MW

**Millinocket:** 1,262 ft long, 27 ft tall concrete and stone gravity dam

**Turbines:** 8 Horizontal Francis

Power capacity: 35.78 MW

**Dolby:** 1,395 ft long, concrete and earth-filled gravity dam

**Turbines:** 3 Horizontal Francis, 2 Tube Inclined, 1 Vertical Kaplan

Power capacity: 20.89 MW

**East Millinocket:** 571 ft long, 28 ft tall concrete and earth-filled gravity dam

Turbines: 6 Horizontal Francis

Power capacity: 6.94 MW

**Millinocket Lake:** Non-powered 635 ft long concrete and earth filled dam with pump station

**Operations:** Store-and-release operation, in conjunction with the Ripogenus Dam upstream.

**Additional Information:** Total hydropower capacity for this 5-dam project is 70.6 MW, with an total average annual generation of 375,500 MWh.
